The Pilgrimage Against Poverty:

Four Pilgrimages will start from different parts of Leeds at 2.30 pm and will converge on the city centre and join a service in St. Anne's Cathedral, Leeds

Each pilgrimage focuses on a particular aspect of poverty. Prayers for that aspect will begin the pilgrimage. People will make their way into the city centre, joining together for the act of worship in St Anne's Cathedral, Great George Street.

The starting points are:

Beeston Hill United Free Church, Malvern Road, Beeston Hill LS11
With a focus on poverty amongst elderly people.

Hinsley Hall 62 Headingley Lane Headingley LS6
With a focus on child poverty.

Bramley St Peter's Hough Lane Bramley LS13 (this walk will be partially by bus!)
With a focus on financial exclusion.

Harehills Baptist Church Hilton Place entrance Harehills LS8
With a focus on poverty amongst people seeking asylum.

Please try to arrive between 2.15 and 2.30.
